As we come to the close of Term 2, we take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support and cooperation throughout the term. It has been a productive and successful period, marked by academic progress, active participation in co-curricular activities and positive learner development.

We are proud of the efforts demonstrated by our learners and the commitment shown by our learners, parents, teachers and school directors.



Report on the term's academic work

During the term, learners successfully completed the planned syllabus across all subject areas and actively participated in Continuous Assessment Tests (CATs) mid-term and end-term examinations.

The school has introduced **Pearson Mathematics in Grade 6**, strengthening numeracy skills and enhancing conceptual understanding. To improve literacy, learners in junior school engaged in **weekly composition writing and book reviews**, which greatly supported their writing and critical thinking abilities.

In the Kindergarten section, **Computer Studies and French** continued to be offered, building early digital and language skills. Additionally, foreign language learning remains a key focus in Junior and High School, with learners actively studying **French, Mandarin, and German**. Overall, there was notable academic progress, supported by targeted remedial and enrichment programs to meet diverse learner needs.

Parents are encouraged to review report forms and support learners during the holiday.

Holiday academic programme

Please note that learners in **Year 11, 12 and 13** will have an extended academic programme during the holiday period. This is aimed at strengthening revision and providing remedial support in preparation for their respective international Pearson Edexcel examinations (**IGCSE, IAS, and IAL**) to be offered in May/June 2026.

Learners will remain in school for an additional week after the school closes for the April holidays. We shall have them from **7th to 10th April 2026** and will also be required to report back one week earlier for further revision from **27th to 30th April 2026**. During this time learners on school transport will have their parents organize for their transport to and from school. The program will be running from **8:00am to 3:30pm. No learner will be allowed to attend those classes without full school uniform.**

Parents are kindly requested to make the necessary arrangements to ensure full attendance during these important sessions, as they are crucial for effective exam preparation and overall academic success.

Students' enrichment programs

This term, the school recorded outstanding achievements in co-curricular activities. The **Chess team** performed exceptionally well in the recently concluded **regional chess competitions held in Wareng High School-Eldoret**. Our learners demonstrated great skill and determination.

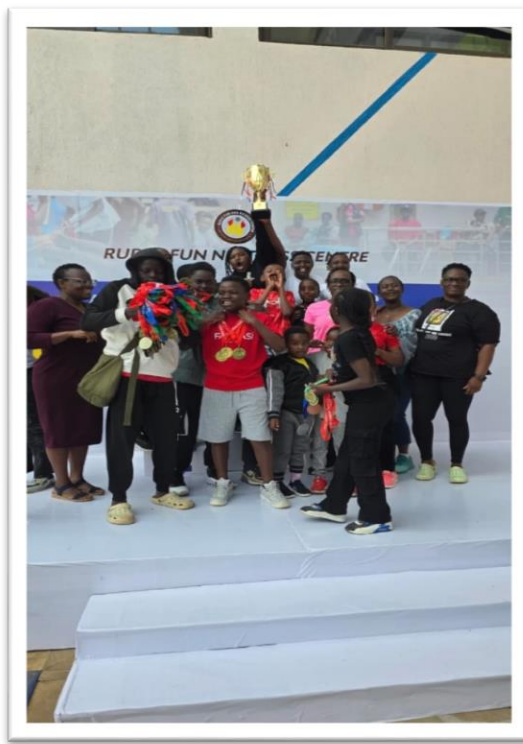
We are proud to announce that **16 students qualified for the National Chess championship**, which will be held at **Mang'u High School-Thika from 3rd to 7th April, 2026.**


