# ACADEMIC UPDATES

## ◆ ACE Programme

## ◆ IGCSE Programme

- Lower Secondary students (Year 7-9) have made good progress in Mathematics, English, Sciences, and Humanities.
- Upper Secondary (Year 10–11) are in active exam preparation, working on past papers and revision tasks.
- Practical work in the sciences has been successfully conducted in line with Pearson Edexcel standards.

- Teachers attended training sessions to enhance lesson delivery and assessment.

**Date: 12th–13th February 2026**

Year 7–9 learners will follow the same 1-night itinerary, with advanced focus on Geography, ecology, and environmental management. Learners will sleep at **St. Mary's Pastoral Centre, Nakuru**.

**Total Cost: Ksh 11,000**

## **Year 10 – 13**

**Destination: Lewa Conservancy Nanyuki**

**Date: 15th–17th February 2026**

A 2-night residential trip focused on wildlife conservation, biodiversity research, and sustainable ecosystems. Learners will participate in guided drives, field discussions, and conservation-based activities.

**Total Cost: Ksh 15,000**
